ROUND HOUSE THEATRE'S 2023-2024 SEASON CONTINUES WITH TONY AND OLIVIER AWARD-WINNER

THE SEAFARER

BY CONOR MCPHERSON DIRECTED BY RYAN RILETTE

December 6 - 31 at Round House Theatre

Bethesda, Md. (October 31, 2023) – Round House Theatre continues its 2022-2023 Season with Conor McPherson's *The Seafarer*, directed by Round House artistic director **Ryan Rilette**. Press Night is Monday, December 11, 2023. **Please see below for complete program details and ticket information**.

The Seafarer will run December 6-31, 2023. Written by celebrated playwright Conor McPherson (Girl from the North Country, The Night Alive), this "enthralling" (The New York Times) dark comedy—set on Christmas Eve on the Irish coast—celebrates camaraderie, redemption, and the hope provided by second chances. The Seafarer was a Broadway and West End hit, winning Tony and Olivier Awards on its way to becoming a regional theatre favorite.

Round House Artistic Director Ryan Rilette directs the production. "Conor McPherson is one of the world's great playwrights, and I'm thrilled to return to him with this revival of *The Seafarer*," says Rilette. "McPherson has written many plays set at the holidays, but I think this

one is the best. Filled with both sadness and laughter, despair and hope for the future, it is the kind of story that will leave you thinking and talking long after the curtain comes down."

The cast includes **Maboud Ebrahimzadeh** (*Ink* and *Oslo* at Round House Theatre; *English* at Studio Theatre), **Chris Genebach** (*Ink* at Round House Theatre; *The Till Trilogy* at Mosaic Theater), **Michael Glenn** (*Ink* and *Gem of the Ocean* at Round House Theatre), **Marcus Kyd** (*The Lyons* at Round House Theatre), and **Marty Lodge** (*Uncle Vanya* and *Our Town* at Round House Theatre). Understudies for this production include **Greg Jones Ellis**, **Steve Lebens**, and **Ryan Rilette**.

The creative team will include Scenic Designer Andrew Cohen, Lighting Designer Max Doolitle, Sound Designer Kenny Neal, Costume Designer Ivania Stack, Fight Consultant Casey Kaleba, Properties Coordinator Andrea "Dre" Moore, Cards Consultant Ryan Phillips, Accessibility Consultant Ray Bloomer, Dialect Coach Rex Daugherty, Casting Director Sarah Cooney, Dramaturg Naysan Mojgani, and Production Stage Manager Che Wernsman.

ARTIST INFORMATION

Ryan Rilette (Director) is in his twelfth season as Artistic Director of Round House Theatre. For Round House, he has directed "We Declare You a Terrorist…", Throw Me on the Burnpile and Light Me Up, Homebound, The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time, Oslo, Small Mouth Sounds, "Master Harold"…and the Boys, The Book of Will, Angels in America: Perestroika, The Night Alive, Fool for Love, This, and How to Write a New Book for the Bible. He also acted in Ink and Uncle Vanya at Round House, has directed at theaters throughout the country, and has acted in a handful of TV shows and films. During his tenure at Round House, he has produced six of the highest grossing seasons in the theatre's history. His productions have

received 81 Helen Hayes Awards nominations and 21 Helen Hayes Awards. Ryan created the theatre's Equal Play Commissioning program, Resident Artist program, Fair Play pay scale for artists, and Free Play ticketing program. Prior to joining Round House, Ryan served as Producing Director of Marin Theatre Company, Producing Artistic Director of Southern Rep Theatre, and co-founder and Artistic Director of Rude Mechanicals Theatre Company. He is the former Board President of the National New Play Network.

Round House Theatre no longer requires that audience members wear masks for most performances in our theatre.
