## THE MOUNTAINTOP

Bethesda, Md. (September 12, 2023) – Round House Theatre continues its 2023-2024 Season with Katori Hall's Olivier Award-winning *The Mountaintop*. Directed by Delicia Turner Sonnenberg, this production is an intimate reimagining that weaves historical fact with surrealist fantasy to show us Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in Memphis's Lorraine Motel. The night before his untimely death, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. returns to his room at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis after delivering a speech to local sanitation workers. While waiting for room service, he is visited by a mysterious and beautiful maid, Camae, with whom he begins a humorous and flirtatious conversation that progresses into a soul-searching discussion about their mutual hopes and fears. When Camae reveals her true identity, Dr. King must reflect on his legacy and the challenges facing the civil rights movement. "Audacious [and] inventive" (Associated Press), the Olivier Award-winning play offers an intimate and empathetic portrait of

one of history's most consequential figures.

#### ARTIST INFORMATION

Katori Hall (Playwright) Memphis native Katori Hall is a Pulitzer Prize- and Olivier Awardwinning playwright and television creator/producer. A two-time Tony Award nominee, she won the 2021 Pulitzer Prize for Drama for her play, The Hot Wing King. Her other works include The Mountaintop, Our Lady of Kibeho, Saturday Night/Sunday Morning, The Blood Quilt, Tina: The Tina Turner Musical, and Hurt Village, which is being developed into a feature film. She's also the executive producer and showrunner of P-VALLEY, the critically acclaimed and groundbreaking Starz drama based on her play Pussy Valley. Katori is an alumna of Columbia University, A.R.T. at Harvard University, and Juilliard. Katori has been published in *The Boston* Globe, The Guardian, and The New York Times. Katori's other awards include the American Academy of Arts and Letters Award in Literature, the Susan Smith Blackburn Award, Lark Play Development Center Playwrights of New York (PONY) Fellowship, two Lecompte du Nouy Prizes from Lincoln Center, Fellowship of Southern Writers Bryan Family Award in Drama, NYFA Fellowship, the Columbia University John Jay Award for Distinguished Professional Achievement, National Black Theatre's August Wilson Playwriting Award, and the Lorraine Hansberry Playwriting Award. She is a proud member of the Ron Brown Scholar Program and the Coca-Cola Scholar Program.

Delicia Turner Sonnenberg (Director) has directed plays for The Old Globe Theatre, La Jolla Playhouse, Actors Theatre of Louisville Humana Festival, Utah Shakespeare Festival, San Diego REP, and Center Rep, among many others. She is a founder and the former Artistic Director of MOXIE Theatre, which she helmed for 12 acclaimed seasons, where she received the Des McAnuff New Visions Award for "Risk Taking Leadership and Body of Work" and "2015 Director of the Year" from the San Diego Theatre Critics Circle. She is currently a Resident Artist at the Old Globe Theatre, and serves proudly on the Board for La Jolla Playhouse. Some honors include: Theatre Communications Group's New Generations Program, San Diego Theatre Critics Circle awards, KPBS Theatre awards, NAACP awards, a Women's International Living Legacy Award, Van Lier Fund Fellowship (Second Stage Theatre) and the New York Drama League's Directors Program.
