(October 19, 2021) – Round House Theatre continues its 2021-2022 Season with *The Great Leap*, written by one of the most produced playwrights in the country, **Lauren Yee**, and directed by **Jennifer Chang**. *The Great Leap* runs November 10 – December 5, 2021, and streams on demand beginning November 26. It's 1989, the University of San Francisco basketball team is headed to China for a "friendship" game, and plucky high school star Manford pesters aging coach Saul enough to talk his way onto the team. Landing in Beijing just before the Tiananmen Square uprising, Manford, Saul, and their Chinese translator/coach Wen Chang are forced to explore their different approaches to basketball and life and to reconcile their own converging histories.

Inspired by her father's short-lived basketball career, playwright Lauren Yee applies her signature technique of colliding the personal with the historical, creating a "stunning" (*LA Times*), unforgettable fable and reminding us that the best stories—even if they aren't real—can still be true. Director **Jennifer Chang** is honored to bring this thrilling socio-political fable to life on the Round House Theatre stage. "This is an exciting experience for me and incredibly personal," says Chang. "These characters are people that I know that I want to see on stage. It is a story about what happens when an ordinary person meets an extraordinary moment. The journey is also about what it means to parent and create family."

The Great Leap exemplifies Round House's continued dedication to producing works that tell vital stories. ROUND HOUSE THEATRE VACCINE AND MASK REQUIREMENTS

Patrons must present a photo ID and show proof that they meet the CDC definition of being fully vaccinated* at the time of entry to into the theatre. Patrons may display proof of vaccination with a physical or digital copy of their vaccination card. (Round House is currently investigating additional digital options for providing proof of vaccination and will communicate any updates with patrons).

Masks will also be required for all guests, regardless of vaccination status, except while eating or drinking in the lobby café area.

Guests who are exempt from vaccination (including children under 12, people with certain medical conditions preventing vaccination, or those with closely held religious beliefs that prevent vaccination) must provide proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within 48 hours of the performance start time.

NOTE: This policy is in effect through December 2021, although we will review current circumstances and CDC and local government recommendations in October to determine whether the mandate may be lifted or extended.

*"Fully vaccinated" means that either 14 days have passed since receiving the second dose of FDA or WHO authorized double-dose vaccines or that 14 days have passed since receiving the sole dose of FDA or WHO authorized single-dose vaccines.
