ROUND HOUSE THEATRE CONTINUES SEASON WITH HIT WEST END KITCHEN DRAMEDY & AMERICAN PREMIERE

NINE NIGHT

January 5 – 30 in reopened Round House Theatre
Streaming on demand beginning January 20

Bethesda, Md. (December 1, 2021) – Round House Theatre continues its 2021-2022 Season with the American premiere of Natasha Gordon's *Nine Night*, directed by **Timothy Douglas**.

Nine Night runs January 5 – 30, 2021 and streams on demand beginning January 20. Press night is Monday, January 10, 2021. Please see below for complete program details and ticket information.

Family matriarch Gloria has died, and her family gathers for the traditional Jamaican Nine Night, a multi-day celebration (and endurance test) full of food, revelry, and a nonstop parade of mourners. Natasha Gordon's debut play—a popular triumph in its 2018 National Theatre premiere and subsequent West End run—explores the tensions of inhabiting two cultures, the inescapable bonds of family, and the many layers of grief in an "exuberantly funny" (*The Guardian*) and profoundly relatable story of the ties that bind. Raved *The Guardian*'s Michael Billington, "Playwrighting debuts don't come much better than this."

Director **Timothy Douglas** describes the unpacking of *Nine Night* at Round House Theatre as a continuous revealing relief of the soul. "It is a gift and privilege for me to more deeply anchor and guide the visceral newness of what blackness is by way of the bittersweet joys lived by this UK-Jamaican family's traditions, culture, and spiritual release."

Nine Night embodies Round House's continued mission to produce new works that foreground artists of color and, by extension, welcome audiences of color. "The number of Black female playwrights represented on America's largest stages is still depressingly small and deeply disproportionate to the number of Black women in our country," says Round House Theatre

Artistic Director Ryan Rilette. "This is the first play by a British Black woman to reach the West End, and I am thrilled to bring this Jamaican-British story to the Round House stage for the American premiere."

ARTIST INFORMATION

Natasha Gordon (Playwright) is a playwright and actress of Jamaican descent. Her debut play, *Nine Night*, enjoyed a sold-out run at the National Theatre in April 2018 before transferring to Trafalgar Studios, making her the first black British female playwright to be produced in the West End. Natasha won the Charles Wintour Award for most promising playwright at the 2018 Evening Standard Theatre Awards. As a performer, her stage credits include *Nine Night* at Trafalgar Studios; *Red Velvet* at Tricycle Theatre; *The Low Road* and *Clubland* at Royal Court Theatre; *Mules* at the Young Vic; and *As You Like It* at Royal Shakespeare Company. Film and TV credits include *Dough*, *Line of Duty*, *Class*, and *Danny and the Human Zoo*.

Timothy Douglas (Director) is overjoyed to return to live theatre at his beloved Round House home, where he staged *Gem of the Ocean, Father Comes Home from the Wars, The Trip To Bountiful, Two Trains Running, Permanent Collection,* and *A Lesson Before Dying,* and performed the role of "The Teacher" in *Small Mouth Sounds.* Area credits include productions for Arena Stage, Folger Shakespeare, Ford's Theatre, The Kennedy Center, The Phillips Collection, Signature Theatre, Theatre Alliance, and Woolly Mammoth Theatre. The performance will stream on demand for virtual viewing beginning on January 20 with tickets available for purchase through January 30.

Socially distanced seating will be available for Wednesday and Thursday performances, with at least two open seats between parties on both levels of the theatre. Socially distanced seating will also be available in the balcony of the theatre for *all* performances during the run.

ROUND HOUSE THEATRE VACCINE AND MASK REQUIREMENTS

Patrons must present a photo ID and show proof that they meet the CDC definition of being fully vaccinated* at the time of entry to into the theatre. Patrons may display proof of vaccination with a physical or digital copy of their vaccination card. (Round House is currently investigating additional digital options for providing proof of vaccination and will communicate any updates with patrons).

Masks will also be required for all guests, regardless of vaccination status, except while eating or drinking in the lobby café area.

Guests who are exempt from vaccination (including children under 12, people with certain medical conditions preventing vaccination, or those with closely held religious beliefs that prevent vaccination) must provide proof of a negative COVID-19 PCR test taken within 48 hours of the performance start time.

NOTE: This policy is in effect through the run of *Nine Night*. We will review current circumstances and CDC and local government recommendations in February to determine whether the mandate may be lifted or extended.

*"Fully vaccinated" means that either 14 days have passed since receiving the second dose of FDA or WHO authorized double-dose vaccines or that 14 days have passed since receiving the sole dose of FDA or WHO authorized single-dose vaccines.
